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Abstrak

Hombo Batu is a unique and historic cultural tradition of the South Nias community, carrying profound and noble values. This tradition, often held during

various customary celebrations, is not merely a physical game, but also a symbol of bravery, strength, and cooperation among community members. In *Hombo Batu*, two groups face each other, attempting to push each other out of a designated area using physical strength, which essentially tests the resilience and unity within a team. This game is deeply rooted in Nias culture, and although it takes the form of a competition, it conveys a very important moral message about the spirit of unity and solidarity Harefa, D., & I Wayan Suastra. This local wisdom is often embedded in traditions and rituals passed down through generations. The theory of character education emphasizes the importance of developing positive character values in individuals, such as courage, honesty, discipline, and cooperation. In the context of Hombo Batu, this tradition functions as a tool for character education, teaching participants, especially younger generation, about significance of teamwork, the courage to face and personal development. Hombo Batu teaches participants to practice discipline, overcome fear, and prioritize the collective good over personal interests (Lickona, 1991).

The theoretical foundation used in the study of *Hombo Batu* encompasses various interconnected aspects, starting from local

wisdom that teaches the noble values of the Nias community, social learning theory which explains how the younger generation learns through social interaction, to social solidarity theory which highlights importance of cooperation in achieving common goals.
